What is the overall deductible ?	Network providers : \$0. Out-of-network providers : Not Covered	See the Common Medical Events chart below for your costs for services this plan covers.
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible ?	Not Applicable	
Are there other deductibles for specific services?	No.	You don't have to meet deductibles for specific services.
What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan ?	Network providers : \$2,500 individual / \$5,000 family; Out-of-network providers : Not Covered	The out-of-pocket limit is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this plan , they have to meet their own out-of-pocket limits until the overall family out-of-pocket limit has been met.
What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit ?	Premiums , balance-billing charges, and health care this plan doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the out-of-pocket limit .

You will pay less if you use a provider in the plan's network . Do you need a referral to see a specialist ?	Yes.	This plan will pay some or all of the costs to see a specialist for covered services but only if you have a referral before you see the specialist .

Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes.

Mia's Simple Fracture

(in-network emergency room visit and follow up care)
